

Parents Staying in Cabins with Groups?
Information and Requirement for “Parent Helper Overnight Training”

Historically Ice Cap has always separated with parents with children in order to meet regulations. This option was stated in the camp information and on the camp website.

- By regulation, no parent is allowed to be counted for leader ratio, or to be left alone, or with less than two leaders, overnight in a tent or cabin with any youth other than their own, without having completed the Parent Helper Overnight requirements.

Groups attending camp will be asked to present documentation that a parent has completed the “Safe Scouting for Parents” required training from myscouts.ca, and will not be required for supervision (adequate number of leaders attending). In addition to these regulations, all parents are required to complete and submit all required Ice Cap camp forms to camp administration. These are the following parent helper regulation and list of forms required to be brought to camp:

Required Parent Camp forms:

- Camp registration form
- Physical fitness and medical form for non members
- Code of Conduct - signed
- Hold harmless – signed

Groups have the ultimate responsibility to ensure that their leaders and parents are fully qualified to attend camp. Groups Scouter(s) at camp are also required to have and carry paper copies of these forms with them at all times:

- Medical and emergency contact forms for everyone. This includes parents.
- Be able to present Ice Cap camp admin these documents:
 - Confirming that all Scouters attending camp are active in myscouts.ca
 - All parent/adult helper regulations have been met (or they may not be able to attend camp or not be allowed to stay overnight).

Also note with 200+ attending this year, we often mix cabins with other groups to ensure we have maximized accommodations. For every parent bunk taken is one less available for a Cub Scout.
